




EDUCATION PATHWAY

Automotive Painter is a non-compulsory trade in Ontario, which does not require certification or registration as an apprentice to practice within the province.

A grade 12 education is required to qualify for an apprenticeship.

The apprenticeship program is approximately two and a half years, consisting of 4,560 hours of on-the-job work experience and 1 level of in-school training.
